
MISSION STATEMENT

ADMINISTRATIVE REFORMS



ISO 9001:2015 CERTIFICATION

Inter Board Committee of Chairmen (IBCC) has upgraded its official procedures, functions and maintenance of records upto international requirements, consequently, attained ISO 9001:2015 Certificate in all process of the organization.

IBCC ACT

In consultation with Ministry of Federal Education & Professional Training (MoFE&PT) and after formal vetting from Law Division Act of IBCC has been drafted and principally approved by CCLC and Cabinet.

UPGRADATION OF OFFICE BUILDINGS

The IBCC Secretariat, Islamabad has been revamped and renovated as per need of office and made to meet the requirements of public attendance/dealing. Besides, public Facilitation Center has been established for better service delivery.

IBCC also attained office space through Ministry of Federal Education and Professional Training for Housing Regional Office, Karachi. Thereafter, office has been renovated and made properly office worthy.

The Lahore office space has been extended to accommodate more people and provide them with better facilitation and services.

ENABLED BIOMETRIC ATTENDANCE

The attendance of IBCC staff at its Secretariat and regional offices is being marked through biometric facility to accurately keep record of employee's attendance. It will help in reducing time theft and in increasing accountability. Other features like leave, overtime etc. are also added in the software.

LIVE SURVEILLANCE OF REGIONAL OFFICES

With the installation of CCTV cameras in IBCC Secretariat and its regional offices, the surveillance of office affairs becomes easy and accessible. It helps in monitoring offices and staff, enhancing customer services, reducing security costs and in crime prevention.

AUTOMATION REFORMS

INCLUSION OF ALL QUALIFICATIONS IN EQUIVALENCE PORTAL

The scope of equivalence portal has been enhanced. The students can apply for equivalence of any foreign or indigenous qualification online using equivalence portal.

CENTRALIZED EQUIVALENCE DATABASE WITH TRACKING

To ensure the transparency and timely delivery of services, Centralized Database has been established for equivalence. It will improve data integrity, reduce data redundancy, and centralized reporting will be possible. Moreover, applicants can track their applications and get notified at each step from submission to delivery of documents.

QR CODE BASED EQUIVALENCE CERTIFICATES

To enhance the security and validate authenticity of equivalence certificates QR Code has been introduced on equivalence certificates. The certificates are now verifiable by scanning the QR code.



ENHANCEMENT IN ONLINE PORTAL FOR ATTESTATION

The scope of Online Portal for Attestation of documents is being enhanced in coordination with member BISEs by fetching verifications directly from BISEs' records. The work is in active progress.

VERIFIABLE ATTESTATION

In place of attestation tickets, QR code based stickers have been introduced to provide authentication and verification on spot. QR Based attestation is verifiable by scanning QR code and ensures security of data as well.

DIGITAL ARCHIVING OF OLD RECORDS

Old records are being digitally archived so that there are minimal chances of data loss. Digital archives will provide faster access to data and will ensure complete data security.

EXAMINATION REFORMS

TWO ANNUAL EXAMS IN A CALENDAR YEAR

The supplementary tag from the SSC & HSSC certificates has been removed to safeguard psychological health and to reduce the stress level of students. Instead, 2nd annual examination will be conducted by all examination boards across the country for providing better opportunities to the students for their future endeavors.

ALLOWING SCC & HSCC PRIVATE STUDENTS TO REGISTER FOR (SCIENCE GROUP)

The students have been allowed to register for SSC & HSCC (Science Group) subject to providing proof for completion of practical from BISEs' affiliated institutions.

RELAXATION IN AGE LIMIT

- For Registration in 9th Class: The minimum age limit has been reduced to 12 years from 14 year for registration in class 9 with effect from 1st of August 2022.
- For Registration of HSSC (Pre-Medical/Pre-Engineering) as Private Candidate: The age limit of private candidate to register for the HSSC (Pre-Medical/Pre-Engineering Group) has been raised to maximum 40 years by virtue of the discretionary power of concerned Chairman.
- For Technical School Certificate (TSC): The maximum age limit has been extended up to 30 years of age for getting admission in Technical School Certificate (TSC).

SWITCHING FROM ABSOLUTE MARKING TO GRADING SCHEME

The IBCC forum approved Grading Formula for Secondary and Higher Secondary level to be implemented by all examination boards of the country by session 2025 in three phases (2023-2025) and also resolved to add GPA and CGPA on certificates.





UNDER THE NEW GRADING SYSTEM, FOLLOWING CHANGES ARE TO FOLLOW:

Passing marks: To raise the educational standards, the passing marks will be 40% instead of 33%

Shifting from 7-points grading to 10-points grading: To control the grade inflation in the country, a 10-point grading alphabetical system (A++, A+, A, B++, B+, B, C, D, E, U) has been introduced instead of 7-point alphabetical grading system (A-1, A, B, C, D, E, F).

Reporting only alphabetical grades and grade points: To stop the culture of race for marks, instead of reporting absolute score and grades, only alphabetical grades represented with the Grade Points will be reported. The grade points will help to calculate Grade Point Average (GPA) and Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA). The grade boundaries, its descriptors and grade points are as follows:

NEWLY RECOGNIZED FOREIGN QUALIFICATIONS

- Basic Education from Ministry of Education (Peru): The Basic Education from Ministry of Education (Peru) has been recognized for issuance of SSC (Relevant Group) equivalence.
- Education from Ministry of Education, Chili: The Humanist-Scientific Secondary Education from Ministry of Education, Chili has been recognized for issuance of HSSC (Relevant Group) equivalence.
- Recognition of Malaysian Qualifications: The students completing 2 years and above diploma from any institution of Malaysia registered with Malaysian Qualification Register (MQR) will be considered for equivalence of HSSC (Relevant Group) of Pakistan subject to having SSC or equivalent qualification prior to that.
- Year First Secondary from the General presidency for the Affairs of Al-Masjid Al-haram and Al-Masjed An-Nabawi Makka Holy Mosque Institute, KSA: The qualification has been approved for grant of equivalence certificate of SSC (Relevant Group) of Pakistan.
- Secondary School Level Completion Diploma from the General presidency for the Affairs of Al-Masjid Al-haram and Al-Masjed An-Nabawi Makka Holy Mosque Institute, KSA: The qualification has been approved for grant of equivalence certificate of HSSC (Relevant Group) of Pakistan.
- Two years Diploma in Imam obtained from College of Islamic Studies, Maldives registered with Islamic University, Maldives: The qualification has been approved for grant of equivalence certificate of HSSC (Humanities Group) of Pakistan.
- High School Grade-10 from Ministry of Education, Iran: The qualification has been approved as equivalent to SSC (Relevant Group) of Pakistan.
- Recognition Of Online Qualifications: In view of COVID 19 pandemic situation, online qualifications obtained overseas in year 2020 and onwards from institutions recognized by respective authorities of that country has been accepted for grant of SSC (Arts) and HSSC (Humanities) equivalence only.

- Three years Diploma Programme in Civil Engineering from the Jammu and Kashmir State Board of Technical Education: The qualification has been approved for grant of equivalence certificate of HSSC (Relevant Group) of Pakistan.
- Three years Diploma of Associate Engineer in Digital Forensic Science: The qualification has been approved as equivalent to HSSC (Pre-Engineering Group) subject to the condition that examinations of the said program should be conducted by the concerned BTEs.
- Three years Diploma of Associate Engineer in Fashion Design and Marketing Technology: The qualification has been approved as equivalent to HSSC (Pre-Engineering Group) subject to the condition that examinations of the said program should be conducted by the concerned BTEs.
- Three years Diploma of Associate Engineer in Textile Design Technology: The qualification has been approved as equivalent to HSSC (Pre-Engineering Group) subject to the condition that examinations of the said program should be conducted by the concerned BTEs
- Three years DAE in Polymer Technology: The qualification has been approved for grant of equivalence certificate of HSSC (Pre-Engineering Group) of Pakistan.
- Specialization in 3rd year of DAE from China (1st & 2nd Year from Pakistan): The IBCC forum approved specialization in 3rd year of DAE from China (1st & 2nd Year from Pakistan), offered by BTEs of Pakistan as equivalent to HSSC (Pre-Engineering) of Pakistan.
- **Two Years Diploma in Tourism & Airport Operations (DTAO):** The qualification has been approved as equivalent to HSSC (Humanities Group).
- **Two years Diploma in Nutrition Science & Hygiene:** The qualification has been approved as equivalent to HSSC (Humanities Group).
- **Two years Diploma in Professional Baking and Patisserie:** The qualification has been approved as equivalent to HSSC (Humanities Group).
- Two years Diploma in Aviation and Business Management (DABM): The qualification has been approved as equivalent to HSSC (Humanities Group).
- Two Years Technician Diploma offered by Punjab Medical Faculty (PMF): The Medical Technology Diploma whose scheme of studies has been approved by NCC/Provincial Curriculum Authority, will be considered as equivalent to HSSC (Medical Technology Group) subject to passing compulsory subjects from any BISE/AIOU.





MEETING OF CENTRAL COORDINATION COMMITTEE

Venue: Ministry of Foreign Affairs, Pakistan

Subject/Point of Discussion: Improved Community Welfare Services

The committee was constituted on the directives of Prime Minister for improving Community Welfare Services for Overseas Pakistanis. 


